Retrieval	New Learning

(leaving everything, starting again when very old, long journey, living in tents). - I can imagine the feelings of Abram, Sarai and the Canaanites at different points of the journey. - I know what a 'covenant' is and I can describe the covenant between God and Abram. - I can accurately retell the story of God's covenant with Abraham, up to the birth of Isaac. - I can recognise the meaning of the story of Abraham and Isaac when it was first told and explain what it means to Christians today. - I can recognise why God's covenant with Abraham is known as the foundation of faith. - I can say why Abraham is a good example of prayer. - I can retell the story of Abraham accurately. - I can describe when Abraham showed his faith in God. - I can understand some of the story of Joseph. - I can reflect on Joseph's life and how the virtues of faith, hope and love in God helped him. - I can make links between some prayers, and the virtues of faith, hope and love. - I can make links between the life of St Oscar Romero and the virtues of faith, hope and love. - I can recall the story of Abraham in detail, showing an understanding of God's covenant with Abraham, and link the story of Abraham with the virtues of faith, hope and love.

Sacrifice	Giving up something important or doing something difficult for the good of someone else. Christians remember Jesus' sacrifice for us.

Prayer	Talking and listening to God. We can pray to say thank you, ask for help, say sorry or share our thoughts and feelings.

Faith	Believing in God and trusting him, even when we cannot see him.	
Hope	Looking forward with confidence and trusting that God is with us and will help us.	
Love	Caring deeply for God and for other people, showing kindness, forgiveness, respect and care.
