



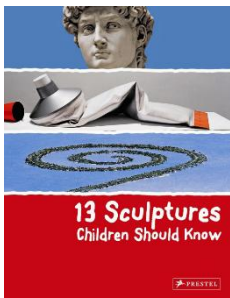

Key Vocabulary	Definition	
Sculpture	A 3D piece of art made by shaping materials such as clay, stone, wood or metal.	Themes: Exploring different sculptures to make individual artwork. Medium: Paint, Paper, Cloth, Felt Tip. Artists: Claes Oldenburg Lucia Hierro
Collage	The process of gluing different materials together to make a new picture or design.	
Pattern	Something that repeats in a regular way such as colours or shapes.	
Shadows	A dark shape that appears when an object blocks light.	
Silhouette	An outline of a person, object or scene against a lighter background.	
Communal	Something that is shared by everyone.
