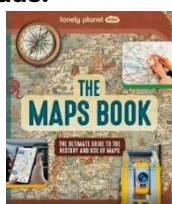
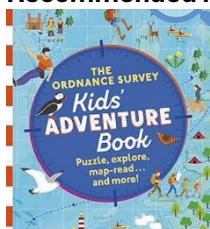
How do maps help us to find our way around?

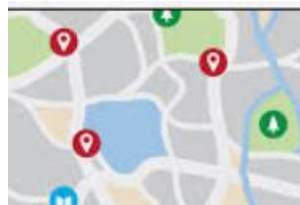

Latitude	Horizontal lines on a map that run east and west. They measure north and south of the equator.	
Longitude	The vertical lines on a map that run north and south. They measure east and west of the Prime Meridian.	
Ordnance Survey Map	A very detailed map of an area of Britain or Ireland, prepared by an organization called the Ordnance Survey.	
Contour line	A line on a map joining points of equal height above or below sea level.	
Digimap	A digital map
