



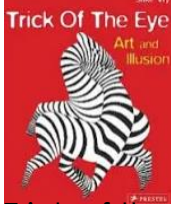

Vanishing point	the point in the distance where parallel lines appear to meet.	
Illusion	a misleading image presented to the vision	
Horizone	the line at which the earth's surface and the sky appear to meet.	
Depth	the distance from the top or surface to the bottom of something.	
Distance	the length of the space between two points.	
Foreshortening	the technique of depicting an object or human body in a picture so as to produce an illusion of projection or extension in space.	
Photorealism	a style of art that attempts to achieve the same level of detail and realism as a photograph.
