Temptation	The feeling or opportunity to do something that we know may be wrong, even though we really want to do it.	
Persuasion	Trying to convince someone to do or believe something.	
Original Sin	The Christian belief that the first sin of Adam and Eve affected all humanity.	
Consequence	What happens because of something we have done or a choice we have made.	
Salvation	Being saved from sin and brought back into a loving relationship with God through Jesus.	
Promise	Something that someone says they will definitely do or keep. In the Bible, God's promises show that he is faithful and can be trusted.	
Free Will	The freedom God gives us to make our own choices and decide how we will act.	
Nicene Creed	A statement of Christian beliefs that Christians say together, especially during Mass. It explains what Christians believe about God the Father, Jesus the Son and the Holy Spirit.	
Sacrament of Baptism	The first sacrament of the Catholic Church. Through Baptism, a person becomes a member of God's family, is welcomed into the Church and receives God's forgiveness of sins.
